Let's Make a Peach Tart

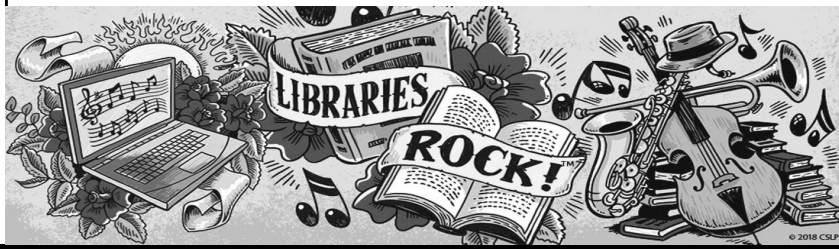

The present Wardens are Mr. F. Trubee Davison and Mr. William Rogers Coe. Vestrymen are; Messrs. Paul B. Barringer, Robert L. Clarkson, Ronald M. Craigmyle, Arthur V. Davis, Robert C. Hattersley, Milward W. Martin, Junius S. Morgan, Julian D. Fairchild, William Bernard Morely, John P. Morgan II, John C. Newsome, Francis E. Powell.

Three men of this parish have been presented for Ordination to the Ministry; the Very Reverend Wayland Mandell, who is Dean of St. Andrew's Seminary in Manila and was present during the Japanese occupation, the Reverend Davis Given, Rector of the Church of the Good Shepherd on an Indian reservation at Fort Defiance, Arizona and the Reverend Robert Arthur Bryan, who was Presented for Ordination in June, 1957.

In January of 1953 a nucleus of concerned women met to form the Woman's Association of St. John's of Lattingtown. Its purpose was to aid the Rector as well as to provide close fellowship among the ladies of the Parish.

The first St. John's of Lattingtown Fair was held in September of the same year and with pride the Woman's Association presented a check to the vestry for \$1500.00 toward the provision of kitchen equipment in the new Church School Building. The Association continued to develop with the growth of the Parish and in January 1955, became a member of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council of the Protestant Episcopal Church. As a Woman's Auxiliary, it is now able to serve not only the Parish but the Diocese of Long Island and the National Church.

The first president of the Auxiliary was Mrs. Walter B. Potts, who was succeeded by Mrs. West P. Woodbridge and the present president, Mrs. H. Easton McMahon. Mrs. Paul B. Barringer is Directress of the Altar Guild and Miss Margaret Weeks is Custodian of the United Thank Offering.

A large corps of dedicated young men has been trained in the reading of the Scriptures and render a real contribution to the Church at the several services.
