2018 Friends Art Lecture Series

Édouard Manet: The Gentleman-painter Who Invented Modernity

Tuesday, May 22 at 7 PM

Presented by Ines Powell, who has lectured for the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Édouard Manet (1832-1883) was a French painter who rebelled against the accepted painting traditions of his time. Early in his career, he began to experiment with new techniques of representation and departed from traditional subject matter by depicting events and circumstances from his own life. Manet was the eldest son of an official in the French Ministry of Justice, who expected his son to become a naval officer. Contrary to his father's wishes, Manet decided to study art and went to Paris to train in the traditional studio of history painter Thomas Couture and to copy works at the Louvre Museum. For much of his career, Manet's subjects and his detached approach to painting produced one critical scandal after another. Only at the end of his career did Manet begin to be recognized for the achievements and innovations of his work.

This article was featured in the *1958 Engagement Book - Saint John's of Lattingtown*

Predecessor of our present church, a small chapel was built in the late eighteen hundreds. It was situated on Lattingtown Road property close to the entrance of "Meuden", on land given by Mr. and Mrs. Zebulon Wilson. This church served as spiritual home for a small group of Christians of all faiths until 1912.

The new church, built as a Union Chapel, was completed in 1912. The Union Chapel Committee consisted of Messrs. D. Fairfax Bush, William D. Guthrie, John P. Morgan, Jr., John T. Pratt and Christopher D. Smithers. The first services in the Union Chapel were conducted by a Presbyterian theological student, Mr. L. E. Saidla.

St. John's of Lattingtown was incorporated as a parish of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States in 1915. Mr. John P. Morgan, Jr., and Mr. John T. Pratt were the first Wardens. The Vestrymen were: Messrs. Christopher D. Smithers, Henry P. Davison, Eugene S. Willard, John E. Aldred, Herbert L. Pratt, William J. Tully, Harold I. Pratt, Harvey Murdock and Madison Ham.

At the time of the completion of the chapel the sanctuary window standing over a simple altar was given by Mr. and Mrs. William D. Guthrie. Later important supplements to the beauty of our church include the handsome carving in the sanctuary and chancel, given by Mr. and Mrs. John P. Morgan, Jr. and copied from carvings in the Chapel of the Knights of the Thistle in St. Giles, Edinburgh.

The rectory was built in 1919 and in 1928 the Parish House was completed as a memorial by Mr. and Mrs. John E. Aldred. The carving in the Parish House follows the tudor style and its stained glass windows depict medieval guildsmen at work. Stonework in the adjoining cloister includes figures from Bible stories. The Church School building was made possible in 1954 by contributions of many of the parish and follows the architecture of the Church and the Parish House.

The Reverend Charles W. Hinton was called as the first rector of St. John's in 1914 and was succeeded in 1931 by the Right Reverend Frank Du Moulin. After Bishop Du Moulin's resignation, the Reverend Rush R. Sloan served from 1943 until 1954 when the present rector, the Reverend Howard Marshall Lowell was called to St. John's of Lattingtown. *(to be continued)*

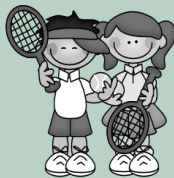

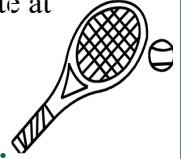
