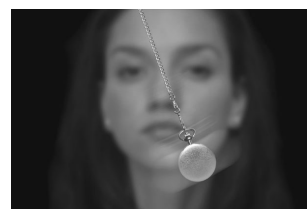
### Summer Reading for Adults, Teens and Kids!



Historical Facts Gathered and Released

Kentuck Lane at Mill Neck

Far back in my musing my thoughts have been cast to the place where the hours of my childhood were passed. Mill Neck at one time was a very industrious center with mills and factories of all kinds and also boat landings. The name Kentuck is probably a corrupted Indian name, taken from the river which bounded the first purchase of Oyster Bay on the westside called Papaquetuck (Page 334 Oyster Bay Records, Vol. 1) now known as the Shu or Beaver Brook. Kentuck has always been a private lane connecting Buckram Road and Feeks Lane, the upper end was to lead from Buckram to Samson Hawxhurst house and saw mill and from there to the salt meadow through which the Papaquetuck flows, this is where the railroad now goes through. This mill, build in the early 1700's, was later owned by Sam Cock and then in the year 1849 it was purchased by Ben Seecker. He operated both a cider mill and a saw mill. These mills were not located on what is now known as Kentuck Pond, but on the upper pond which wad dug and damed for the Samson Hawxhurst mill further to the southwest. On this section of the lane there is to be found the old Tilley Cemetary with many old stones.
