Registration begins on Tuesday May 28 for Summer Volunteering and all of our Teen Summer Events. Grades 6 - 12.

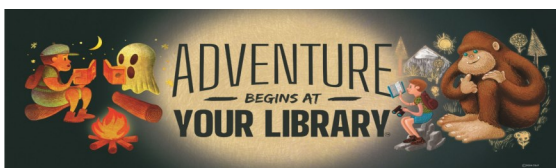
Earn Community Service credit and gain lifelong experience while volunteering.
